### State of the District Report

Superintendent **Mark McDonald** shared that some of the highlights of this year's State of the District report include an increased number of classroom interventions; 90% of all grades are A, B. or C; the completion of the Transition Facility; the recruitment of a more diverse work force; media training for Board members and administrators; work with the Downers Grove Chamber of Commerce and the Downers Grove Economic Development Corporation; and quantitative analysis of programs. He also stated that several of the tasks in the Strategic Plan have been completed.

### **Instructional Technology Plan**

One of the goals of the Strategic Plan was to develop a plan for implementation of a large scale technology model. Rod Russeau, director of technology and information services, and Gina Ziccardi, assistant superintendent, shared information on the Technology Plan. Ms. Ziccardi said that it is important to remember, "It really isn't a tech plan, it's a learning plan. This is our oneto-one learning initiative." She went on to say that technology is embedded in all of the professional development strands. In 2014-15, the one-to -one pilot will be expanded to include 1,500 students, in all grade levels, and 37 teachers, and will be used to simulate a larger scale roll out of one to one learning. Mr. Russeau shared that District 99's technical score was in the  $94^{
m th}$ percentile during a recent outside assessment.

### **End of Year Financial Report**

Controller Mark Staehlin shared that last year the District ended with a \$203,000 deficit. A large portion of the deficit is attributable to higher than expected tuition costs for special education students who are outplaced. He also said that the State is catching up on amounts owed to the District, but is paying on a more heavily pro-rated basis.

### 2014-2015 Tentative Budget

Mark Staehlin presented information on expected revenues and expenditures for 2014-2015. Overall, revenues are anticipated to increase by 2.2% and expenditures increase by 2.9%. Three items figure predominately into the increase in expenditures – rising special education tuition, higher bussing costs and the purchase of 1,300 new Chromebooks for the one-to-one pilot. Mr. Staehlin explained that the tentative budget must be on public display for a minimum of 30 days and must be approved by September 30, 2014. The public hearing on the budget is scheduled for 7:45 p.m. on September 15, 2014 at the District 99 Administrative Service Center.

### **Refunding 2004 Bonds**

The average interest rate on General Obligation bonds issued in 2004 is 4.75%, according to **Mark Staehlin.** These bonds can be refunded with a new interest rate of 1.35% including expenses, which will yield about a \$2 million dollar savings. The savings will be used to pay off some debt, increase the District's reserves and provide a savings to taxpayers.
