



Oliver Sacks

Neurologist

Mr Sacks (born July 9, 1933) is a British-american neurologist, writer and amateur chemist. He is a Professor of Neurology at New York University School of Medicine. Between 2007 and 2012, he was professor of neurology and psychiatry at Columbia University, where he also held the position of "Columbia Artist". Before that, he spent many years on the clinical faculty of Yeshiva University's Albert Einstein College of Medicine. Sacks is the author of numerous best-selling books, including several collections of case studies of people with neurological disorders. His 1973 book *Awakenings* was adapted into an Academy Award-nominated film of the same name in the 1990 starring Robin Williams and Robert De Niro. He and his book *Musicophilia: Tales of Music and the Brain* were the subject of "Musical Minds", an episode of the PBS series *Nova*.
