Sallie W. (Penny) Chisholm is a U.S. biological oceanographer at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. She is an expert in the ecology and evolution of ocean microbes. In 1985 her team discovered Prochlorococcus, which is the smallest and most abundant photosynthetic cell on the planet. In 2013 she received the National Medal of Science by President Obama. Her advice to students: "Follow what interests you and it will lead you places you never imagined!"
