

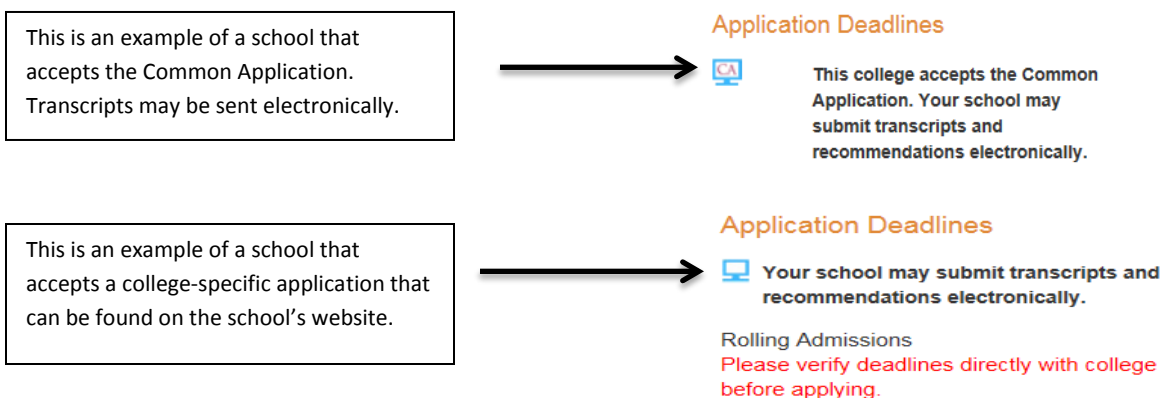
College Data Collection Directions

Completing the College Data Collection page will help students learn how to find information needed to apply for admission in the fall of senior year.

College: Colleges you plan to apply to for next year

Average GPA/ACT or SAT Scores: From the Colleges Tab, type in the name of the college into the search bar. Click on the name of the college to view the college profile. Scroll down and click on the Admissions tab for middle 50% and average test scores.

Common Application or College Specific Application: From the Colleges Tab, type in the name of the college into the search bar. Click on the name of the college to view the college profile. This is the General tab of the college profile. Scroll down until you see “Application Deadlines.” The icons pictured below will also show in the “Colleges I’m Thinking About” list.



Application Due Date: The application due date may also be found in the General tab of the college profile. It can also be found on the college's website in the Admissions section. Priority or early action deadlines often coincide with scholarship, financial aid, and honors college deadlines.

Teacher and Counselor Letters of Recommendation: The location of this information on college websites varies from school to school. Often it can be found by following the links for “Admissions” and then “Admission requirements.”

Majors of Interest: Use the school's website to find this information. Lists of majors are typically found by following links such as “Academics” or “Undergraduate Majors and Degrees.”

Affordable: Students should work with their families to complete the net price calculator for any school being considered. The calculator can be found in the financial aid/cost sections of school websites or by typing “net price calculator” into the search bar on a college's website.

Admissibility Rating: Use ACT/SAT average or middle 50% numbers, scattergrams, and information from the school's admissions page to determine this rating.
