- Prom is coming up on April 22nd. Seniors you have less than two weeks to purchase your tickets. Students intending to bring guests that are not South High students are on a quicker timeline.

April is a busy month with some great opportunities to get involved.

- On Thursday and Friday, South High Theatre presents the One-Act Plays.
 This series of short plays not only highlight our students in acting roles, but they are all directed by students. It is a great chance to see theatre productions in a more intimate setting.
- At the end of the month, we are proud to present the spring musical as our students perform "Cinderella." This no doubt will offer fun for the whole family.
- The Mustang Trot 5K will be held on Sunday, April 9th. This friendly race represents the last fund-raising event for our all-school philanthropy project. The efforts of our staff and students has resulted in more than \$20,000 being raised to support Special Olympics.
- On April 5th, all of our underclassmen will be taking tests. The juniors will take the required SAT while the freshmen and sophomores take the corresponding PSAT for their grade levels. Make sure that your students eat a good breakfast as they will be in their testing locations from 8:00 to nearly 1:00 that day. There is a detailed page created on our website about testing and the things students need. Freshmen and sophomores will need to bring their charged Chromebooks for an activity at the end of testing.
