The comparison of these scores from year to year helps to identify areas of strength and needed growth for individual students and groups of students.

Program Need. Standardized test scores, and other information, assist teachers in identifying student needs and in directing students to programs of study that better support the students. EXPLORE®, PLAN®, ACT® and PSAE test results also assist district staff in aligning curriculum and instruction with learning targets measured by these instruments.
