1. CLOSED SESSION

2. RECONVENE TO REGULAR SESSION

3. STUDENT PERSPECTIVES

4. 2017-2018 PROPOSED CALENDAR

Dr. McDonald stated that, at the Board's direction, the Calendar Committee that worked on the 2016-2017 calendar reconvened to draft a 2017-2018 calendar in which the first semester ended before the winter break. Dr. McDonald reviewed the calendar draft proposed by the Calendar Committee and shared the additional recommendations of the Committee which included: establishment of a committee to look at graduation; establishment of a committee to look at how parent conferences are structured; and continuation of the Calendar Committee. Dr. McDonald stated the input from stakeholders gathered from the two surveys as well as input from District 99's feeder schools was taken into consideration by the Committee when drafting the 2017-2018 calendar. After discussion, the consensus of the Board was to accept the recommendation of the Calendar Committee for the 2017-2018 calendar.
