Bid specifications were developed for public bidding of custodial, maintenance and grounds supplies for the 2018-19 fiscal year. The bid was advertised in a local newspaper and vendors on our current bidders list were suitably notified. Twenty-two vendors submitted bids. The following vendors submitted the lowest prices for one or more products.

For several years now, the bulk purchasing of custodial, maintenance and grounds supplies has been very successful and this year proves that once again. A total of twenty-two vendors bid on the supplies needed for District 99. As a result, we experienced reduced unit prices for a majority of the products. Many of these vendors have submitted bids in the past few years and what we are seeing is lower prices for the same products they bid on the year before. This, in turn, is saving our school district thousands of dollars for the purchase of these supplies.

The bid totals this year are slightly higher than last year. Our order a year ago was reduced to eliminate overstocked supplies at our campuses. We depleted those items and are replenishing with a better calculation of our supply needs for a given school year. On a yearly basis, some supplies are hard to predict what amounts will be needed, such as salt for our winter season. On these, I always weigh on the side of ordering a bit more so that we lock in a low unit cost. Overall, we still see unit costs go down on almost all items ordered this year, which is very positive.

We have reviewed all bids and believe we are getting the lowest prices available and all vendors meet our requirements. Bid totals are also within our budget projected for supplies.

We urge the Board of Education to approve award of contract for custodial, maintenance and grounds supplies to the vendors listed above in the aggregate amount of \$125,939.22.
