

PURSUING TECHNICAL & PROFESSIONAL CAREERS

Students may choose to pursue technical or professional careers by enrolling in an education program that may be shorter or more focused than the traditional college path. Examples of these careers follow but are not limited to this list.

CTE Course - Internship

Provides an off-campus experience enabling hands-on career exploration. This program creates partnerships between students, school, and community helping students identify and evaluate various pathways to their future.

- Students are required to intern an average of four hours per week
- Attend a weekly meeting with the teacher and complete projects/assignments.
- The course will be offered in a blended format where students will meet once a week with their teacher in addition to completing weekly assignments pertaining to their internship. The weekly meeting and activities can be conducted via email, online chat, or face to face.
- The internship hours will be completed outside of the normal school day.
- Students observe daily operations, dialogue with personnel, gain an understanding of how the career/job functions within a total organization, and participate in career explorations and learning experiences at the internship site.

Apprenticeship Information

 Apprenticeship- a paid training that can last 1-4 years. Typically in a trade.

Requirements

- 18 years old
- High school Diploma/ GED
- Pass physical exam/ drug test
- Take aptitude test
- Have a valid driver's license
- Eligible to work in the United States

Things to know...

- Applying to more than one TUA is a good idea
- It can take up to a year or more to get accepted
- Getting training in a non-union apprenticeship program can increase your odds at getting accepted into a TUA
- You are paid while you are training and the amount increases every year.
- You receive benefits such as healthcare
- These are very financially lucrative, most journeymen earn at least \$100,000 after 10 years

How to apply

<u>CISCO</u> is a nonprofit organization that has a listing and links of all apprenticeships in the Chicagoland area. Click on any apprenticeship to apply. For some apprenticeships you will have to go to the site in person to drop off the application.

<u>HIRE360</u> is a nonprofit that provides individual counseling on how to get accepted into trade union apprenticeships. Fill out their on line assessment form and a counselor will contact you to help you with the process

The hospitality industry is the nation's largest private sector employer. If you are friendly and energetic, creative, self-motivated, a problem solver and a hands-on participant, then you may be right for a career within this industry.

Culinary Arts graduates become chefs in major restaurants or start their own businesses. Typical salaries include the following: **Executive Chef**: \$73,400 **Sous Chef**: \$42,300

Can I find a job after graduation?

Currently, more jobs exist than employees to fill then. We are very lucky to have many job opportunities in the DuPage County area.

How much money can I make upon graduation?

Graduate salaries are dependent upon several factors: the size of the company, the student's needs for benefits, and the student's work experience. In general, our students will earn an hourly wage ranging from \$10 to \$12 per hour. If a student is in a managerial position, a salary range of \$20,000 to \$30,000 per year is not uncommon. Please remember that the opportunities for advancement for well-prepared people are great, as the industry can never meet the demands of employer needs.
